Dear Parent/Guardian:

The School District of Lee County is committed to providing information to you regarding your child's teacher and paraprofessional qualifications in a timely manner upon request.

You have the right to request the following information:

- Whether the teacher has met state licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualifications of licensing criteria have been waived.
- The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree.
- Whether your child is provided services by paraprofessionals, and, if so, their qualifications.
- Your child's level of achievement on each of the State academic assessments.

You will be notified in writing if your child has been assigned or has been taught for more than four consecutive weeks by a teacher who is non-state certified and has not met the professional qualifications required by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).

Please be assured that the School District of Lee County is dedicated to providing our students with a quality education. The information regarding the qualifications of your child's teacher and/or the classroom paraprofessional may be obtained from Mrs. Leigh Ann Cain—Assistant Principal—239-458-0362

STAY CONNECTED THROUGH FOCUS PARENT PORTAL



Lee County's **FOCUS Parent Portal** provides parents/guardians a real-time view of their child's assignment grades, attendance information, current grade averages in all classes, as well as progress monitoring results.



HOW TO REGISTER

- https://lee.focusschoolsoftware.com/focus/
- If you are creating an account for the first time, click CREATE ACCOUNT at the bottom of the page.
- Enter the information in all the required fields.
- Once all required information has been entered click "Add a Student" button.
- ➤ To add another child, click "I would like to Add Another Child." Enter all the information required and click Add Student. (Note that this step can be completed as many times as necessary, or later, if needed).
- Otherwise, click "I am Finished Adding Students Create My Account."
- On the next screen, your child's name will display.
- Click the link to log in to the Parent Portal. Your child's school will receive the request to link the parent account to your child's account. Once the school has verified the information, you will receive an email in 1-2 business days stating that access has been granted with a link to the ParentPortal login screen.
- Contact your child's school if you have any questions or problems accessing the account.

Note: In the future you will need to use the username provided and the password you create to access your portal again.

<u>Expectations</u> - Expect the best from your child. Expect your child to use the "ABC" rule:


- Ask for help when needed.

WHAT IS TITLE I?

Title I is a federal grant for schools to help meet the needs of at-risk and low income students. The goal of Title I is a high-quality education for every child. Title I grant money is used to improve student achievement, increase instructional resources, and build parent relationships through involving families.



PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT PLAN

Parent and Family Engagement plans are written with parents and school staff together each year. Information in the plans includes:

- How parents are involved in the school and their child's education.
- When the Annual Title I Meeting will be held to discuss Title I information and make decisions about funds
- What workshops will be offered to parents to help build their involvement with their child's education.

PARENT'S RIGHT TO KNOW

Parents must be informed of their rights. Each year, a letter is sent home from the schools to the parents informing them of the following rights:

- Parents have the right to request and receive timely information on the professional qualifications of their child's teachers and paraprofessionals.
- Parents have the right to be informed if their child is assigned or taught for four or more weeks by a teacher who is not state certified
- Parents will be provided information on the level of achievement their child received on all the state assessments.
- Communication will be provided in a language parents can understand.

SCHOOL-PARENT-STUDENT COMPACT

Parents work with the school each year to write and approve the compact during SAC and parent group meetings. The compact outlines the responsibilities of the parents, teachers, principal and students, as they all work together for student achievement.

PARENTS AS PARTNERS IN STUDENTS' LEARNING

Forty years of research supports that students whose families are involved in their learning earn better grades, enroll in higher-level programs, have higher graduation rates, and are more likely to go to college. It is important for parents to be involved at their child's school.

Parents can get involved in a number of ways:

- Attend parent workshops offered by the school and attend school events.
- Check for homework to be completed daily and talk to your child about what they are learning in school.
- Join the School Advisory Council (SAC) and/or Parent Association to be a part of making important decisions at the school.
